AN ORDINANCE CREATING A DONATION FUND FOR THE KOSCIUSKO COUNTY JCAP PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Kosciusko County Jail Chemical Addition Program ("JCAP") is believed to be beneficial to the local community; and

WHEREAS, private citizens may have an interest in contributing toward the Kosciusko County JCAP program; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to provide by way of ordinance for a special fund to enable private citizens to make contributions toward the Kosciusko County JCAP program;

NOW, **THEREFORE**, **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of County Commissioners of Kosciusko County, Indiana, that:

SECTION 1. There is hereby created a special fund, to be designated and known as the "JCAP Donation Fund." This fund shall be a continuing, non-reverting fund, with all balances remaining therein at the end of each year. Such balances shall not lapse into the county general fund, or ever be directly or indirectly diverted in any manner to uses other than those stated in this Section.

SECTION 2. All donations made to the Kosciusko County JCAP program shall be deposited into the JCAP Donation Fund.

SECTION 3. The fund shall be administered by the Kosciusko County Auditor and all donations deposited therein shall be used for the benefit of the Kosciusko County JCAP program. Expenditures from this fund shall be made without appropriation.

SECTION 4. Annual financial reports shall be prepared by the Kosciusko County Auditor and reviewed by the Kosciusko County Board of Commissioners.

THIS ORDINANCE shall be in full force and effect on AUGUST 6, 2019. Passed and adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Kosciusko this 6th day of AUGUST, 2019.
